Dr. Kathy Irene Kennedy is a public health scientist and educator who has conducted numerous studies in reproductive health, especially in the areas of lactation, fertility, and contraception. She has directed several multi-center international studies, and has written on women's health, on human immunodeficiency virus (HIV/AIDS), and on postpartum issues. She has worked in some twenty countries and several American Indian reservations. She also has directed health and environmental leadership development programs for two decades. Currently Dr. Kennedy is most active in education and public health practice.

In research, Dr. Kennedy has worked as an advisor to the WHO Reproductive Health Research Programme in Geneva, Switzerland, where she directed data analysis and report writing for a large international prospective study. She has served on the Technical Advisory Boards for research for the Linkages project of the Academy for Educational Development in Washington, DC and for the Institute for Reproductive Health at Georgetown University Medical Center in Washington, DC. She provides peer review of scientific papers to a number of journals and reviews research proposals for several foundations and institutions. She also publishes on leadership development topics.

In education, Dr. Kennedy is Clinical Professor at the Colorado School of Public Health, University of Colorado Denver at the Anschutz Medical Campus. Here or elsewhere her courses have included Public Health Fundamentals, Epidemiology, Global Public Health, Maternal and Child Health, Injury Epidemiology, and Public Health Leadership in programs toward the Master and Doctor of Public Health degrees. She has extensive experience as a presenter for in-service training and continuing education. At the Colorado School of Public Health, Dr. Kennedy founded the Master of Public Health in Maternal and Child Health Programs and the Certificates in Global Public Health and Maternal and Child Health.
