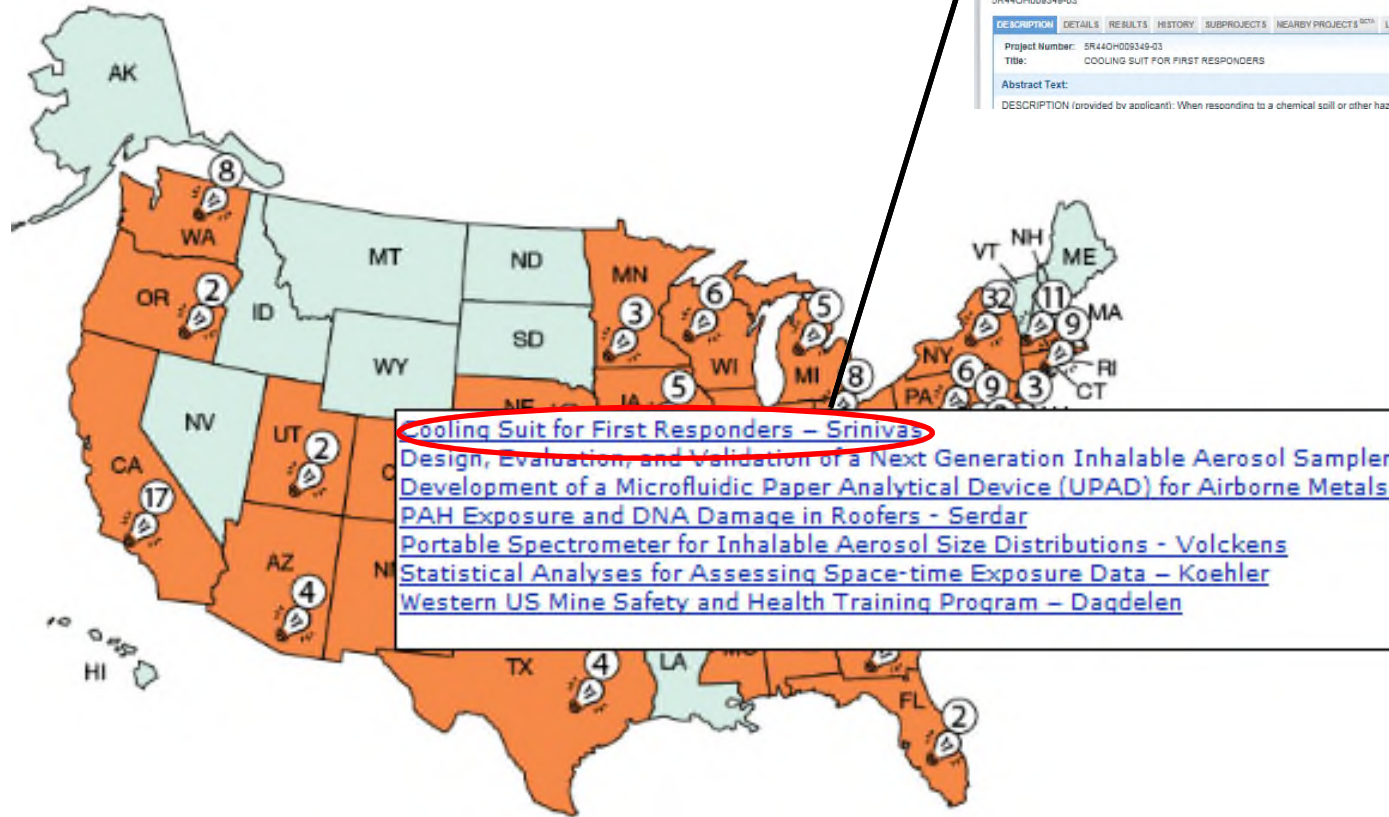
Individual Research Grants

Each year NIOSH's Extramural Research and Training Program funds competitive extramural projects that are scientifically sound and related to various NIOSH program priorities. Studies are supported to identify occupational populations-at-risk, develop methods for measuring exposures to hazards and detecting adverse health effects, determine the prevalence and incidence of occupational hazards, understand the etiology of occupational diseases and injuries, and reduce or eliminate exposures to hazards. Support is provided for both laboratory and field studies involving humans, as well as laboratory studies with various animal models and cell lines. 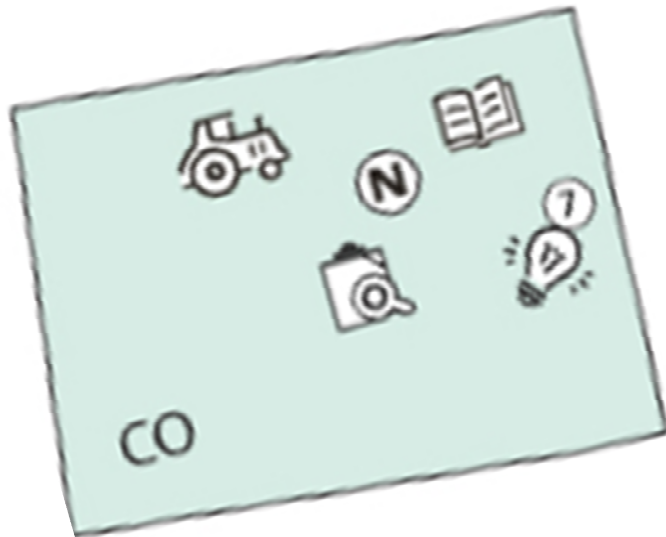

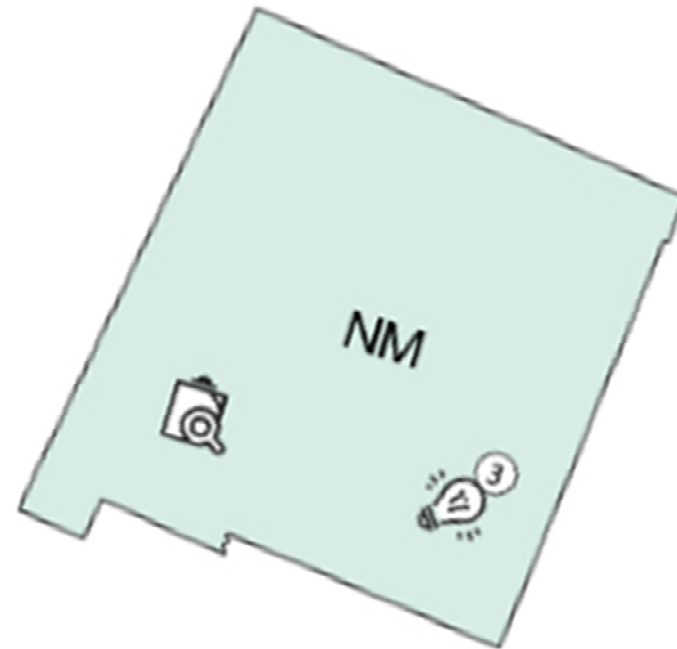

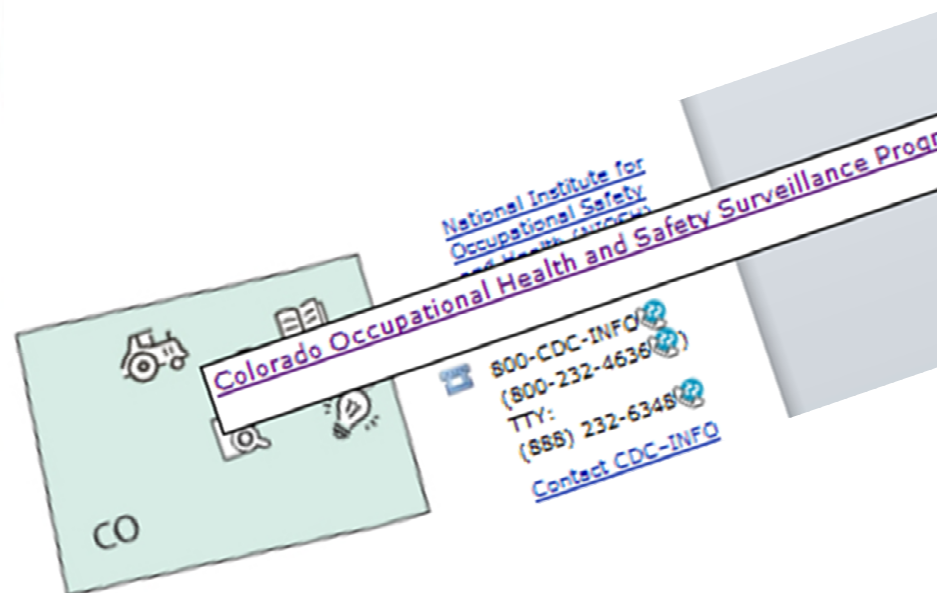
